## **ACCIDENT**

## involving the glider registered D-4407

## D-4407 OF 14 MARCH 1999

**Event:** Collision with trees

**Probable cause:** Incorrect assessment of aerology near terrain.

**Consequences and damage:** Pilot killed, glider destroyed.

Type of aircraft: Przedsiebiostwo Doswiadczalno SZD 55-1, single-

seat glider.

Date and time: Sunday 14 March 1999 at 15 h 50.

Owner: Club.

Place: La Motte du Caire (04), south-west slope of Mount

Jalinier, altitude 1400 metres.

Type of flight: Local.

Persons on board: Pilot.

**Licenses and experience:** Pilot 34, VV issued by Germany, around 275 flying

hours, hours on type unknown.

**Meteorological conditions:** Estimated at the site: wind 140° to 160°/14 to 20 kt,

visibility 20 km, cloud 2/8 Cu base at 1800 m, 3 to 4/8 of Ac base towards 3000 m, 6 to 7/8 de Ci towards 7500 m, temperature 6 °C, turbulence moderate locally strong on crests between 1500 and

2000 metres.

## **Circumstances**

The pilot had arrived at La Motte du Caire two days before accompanied by other members of his aeroclub. He was performing his first solo flight after a dual control check flight the day before. It appears that these were his first flights since June 1998. The aircraft was winched at 14 h 50 without incident and at about 15 h 45 the pilot said on the radio that he was flying over the summit of La Malaup seven kilometres north of the field. At about 15 h 50 another glider in flight signalled the presence of the wreck of the D-4407 about 100 m below the summit of Mount Jalinier, located about 5 km north-east of the AD. Examination of the site and the wreckage showed that the aircraft had struck the tops of several small trees before crashing into a larger tree facing south-east, on a slope with a steep south-west facing slope. It was probably flying at quite a low speed.

Taking into account the terrain and the meteorological conditions, the pilot probably encountered unfavourable aerology.
